- Prioritizing catalog

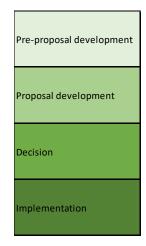
Regional Issues Forum has an expanded role

Some proposed initiatives not included in the roadmap

- Items included in roadmap needed to be:
 - Broadly identified as priority among stakeholders
 - Just and reasonable
 - Feasible (resources & scope, implementation timing, interdependencies with other initiatives)
 - Contribute to reliable and efficient operation of markets
 - Aligned with ISO strategic objectives
- All catalog submissions reviewed and received public status disposition
- Stakeholders encouraged to review dispositions and revise/resubmit

Of 132 submissions, remaining 77 were not catalog items: non-discretionary, urgent requests, part of existing stakeholder processes or data and analysis requests.
